What's New for 2021-2022?

- Completely Online Registration – There will be one in person drop off date in July, date to be announced.
- New Hockey Canada Online Registration System requires [My Spordle Account](#) in the parents name, with all members being added to that account and registered for hockey through Spordle.
- Club D is now included in your registration fees, the number of sessions depending on which stream you select.
- Recreational League in U9, U11, and U13 will relaunch after the inability to start the first season last year.
- The Female Program, [SWZ Comets](#), in U9, U11, and U13 will register directly through South West Zone Hockey.
- [Streams of Play Program](#) gives the option of Recreational League, Community, Development or Competitive.
- Coach and Asst Coach Police checks are online.

Only the base fee (Community Fee) will be charged at time of registration.

Fees can be paid in full at time of registration or in 3 payments by credit card, e-transfer, or cheque.

Additional Fees for Development and Competitive will be collected in September after team placements with payments made in installments to allow for team fundraising to reduce the fee.

Returning Players, please register by July 31, 2021. Any Returning Player registration received or completed after July 31, 2021 will have an additional \$100 Late Fee.

Respect In Sport (RIS) Parents Course

Hockey Alberta has arranged for the RIS Parents Course expiry date to be extended by 1 year to make up for the 2020-2021 season. The RIS program otherwise has a 4 year expiry.

The [RIS Parents](#) program is a proactive, education program that empowers parents with the tools to ensure the game is enjoyable and respectful for themselves, their children and other stakeholders in the game. Hockey Alberta mandated that at least one parent or guardian of each player registered in minor hockey in Alberta must complete the one hour, \$12.60, payable to RIS, online RIS Parents Program as a conditions of their participation. Financial Assistance with Fees

Confederation Hockey offers a [Bingo](#) program to help with individual family fundraising towards Registration Fees.

There are also a variety of funding programs; [KidSport](#), [Jumpstart](#), [Lace Em Up](#). KidSport Edmonton provides support for families facing financial barriers so they can participate in registered sport programs. KidSport approves up to \$125 dollars per year per player, Confed Hockey will also provide up to \$250 for those families approved for KidSport.

Online Registration

New Registration System.

The links, accounts, and passwords previously used to register will not work with the new system.

Hockey Canada has rolled out a new registration system for 2021-2022.

- FIRST STEP: Every family will need to create themselves a new account with [Spordle My Account](#) in the parents name.
- Once a new account is created you can then add/link all your related members/participants to the account. Search players and coaches by name and date of birth to locate and select.
- Once participants have been added to the account you will be able to register for your desired club directly through the **Spordle Dashboard** or the by clicking [Confederation Hockey Online Registration](#) if no longer in Spordle.

New Players:

New Players will need to complete the [RIS Parents Course](#) first to create a Hockey Canada file in the new players name.

New Players, that are siblings of existing players, will first have to be added to the [RIS Parents Course](#) file under Child Management to create a Hockey Canada file in the new players name.

All new players, please submit new player documents:

- Copy of Birth Certificate or Passport
- Copy of Alberta Health Care Card
- Copy of Proof of Residency by way of a recent utility (gas, water, power) bill in the parents name showing the service address and date. First page of the EPCOR bill is perfect.

Transferring Players:

Players that are coming to Confed Hockey from another club, please email registrar@confedhockey.org or advise you would like to register with Confed Hockey and double check that you are within in the catchment so we can welcome you to the club.

All transferring players, please submit:

- Copy of Birth Certificate or Passport
- Copy of Alberta Health Care Card
- [Hockey Alberta Parent Declaration Form](#) with uploaded Proof of Residency by way of a recent utility (gas, water, power) bill in the parents name showing the service address and date. First page of the EPCOR bill is perfect.

Once documents are received the transfer will be requested electronically from your previous club. As soon as that transfer comes through you will be able to register with Confed Hockey.

Payment Options:

Payments can be made by credit card, e-transfer, or cheque.

Registration Fees can be paid in full at time of registration or in 3 payments; at time of registration, September 1, and October 15.

Confederation Hockey Streams of Play

Confederation Hockey Club (“CHC”) is excited to announce the delivery of new programming for the 2021-22 season in the form of a “Streams of Play” model. This [Confederation Hockey Streams of Play package](#) provides information on the new programming model and the associated fees.

What: Hockey Edmonton supports the adoption of a “Streams of Play” model. This model is intended to provide three or four distinct program options to families within the existing age categories that vary in cost and time commitment.

Why: A “Streams of Play” model gives families the opportunity to participate in a hockey program that best suits their needs. We have heard from families who unexpectedly encountered additional costs and time commitments that were not made clear up front. Our new “Streams of Play” model adds more transparency to the cost and time commitment for playing hockey.

When: CHC is implementing this new delivery model immediately, effective for registration in the 2021-22 season

Selection of Program

(U7):

- Registration for the U7 programs, Discovery (2017), JR Timbits (2016), and SR Timbits (2015) is dependent on birth year.
- During online registration 2015 and 2016 players will be able to indicate which program they would prefer.
- A player born in 2017 can only play in Discovery.
- For players born in 2016 you will be asked if you have a preference to move up to SR Timbits or down to Discovery. In order to move up, players will have to participate in the timed evaluation in September and place in the top 25% of times for the age group higher (SR Timbits).
- For players born in 2015 you will be asked if you have a preference to move down to JR Timbits. Please note the following season you will still move on to U9.

U9, U11, and U13:

- All programs have designated birth years – U9 (2013, 2014), U11 (2011, 2012), U13 (2009, 2010)
- Rec League players will select the Rec League fee and be in that program
- During online registration all players (except Rec League) will be reminded of the [Confederation Hockey Streams of Play](#), with a suggestion to review the programs in preparation to indicate their choice of program.
- Families will be asked:
 - **What is the highest level of play your family chooses to participate in for this player?**
- During team formation, every effort will be made to place players on a team within their chosen program, while also placing them in an appropriate tier.

Volunteer Deposit Program

Confederation Hockey is a volunteer run organization that depends on the volunteer assistance of its members to function successfully. Volunteers are essential to maintaining and growing Confederation Hockey Club. The more volunteers we have, the better our association becomes!

Overview of the [2021-22 Volunteer Deposit Program](#):

- Every family is required to complete volunteer commitments for 2021-22 unless they have chosen to pay the volunteer opt out fee on their registration.
- The number of volunteer commitments for each family is dependent on the number of players and which category they are in.
- We would rather have families complete volunteer commitments and contribute to the success of the club than pay the opt out fee.
- U7 – Discovery, U7 – JR Timbits, and Rec League players are required to complete ONE VOLUNTEER COMMITMENT per player
- U7 – SR Timbits, U9, U11, and U13 payer families are required to complete TWO VOLUNTEER COMMITMENTS per player.
- Volunteer deposit cheques are \$250 per commitment and are collected prior the registration being accepted and completed.
- In the event that a family does not complete their volunteer commitments, the volunteer deposit cheque will be cashed.

September 6, 2021 – Start day for U11, U13, and Goalies Evaluations
September 11, 2021 – Start day for U9 Evaluations
September 11, 2021 – Start day for U7 Evaluations
October 16 and 17, 2021 – Club Picture Weekend
December 27 – 31, 2021 – Confederation Hockey Christmas Tournament
January 2022 – Quickcard Minor Hockey Week
Evaluation dates are subject to change and will be updated as needed.

U13 AA

If your child will be trying out for U13 AA please do not register for Confed until such time as you know if they are returning to Confed.

The Confed Hockey Returning Player Late fee of \$100 as of July 31 does not apply to those registered to try out at U13 AA

Player Evaluations

U7 – Discovery does not have an evaluation.

U7 – JR Timbits has an optional preseason skate to run through our evaluation drills and equipment. In the event you would like to challenge to move from JR Timbits to SR Timbits, you will need to attend the preseason skate.

U7 – SR Timbits has a preseason skate to run through our evaluation drills and equipment.

U9, U11, and U13 Rec League does not have evaluations.

At U9, U11, and U13 the purpose of Evaluations is to place the children on teams with similar ability level players that will play against similar tiered teams in the Hockey Edmonton programs.

Bingo Credit Opportunities

Bingos are optional. Confed Hockey offers bingos as an option for individual family fundraising towards registration fees. Each single shift (5.5 hours) earns a credit of \$75.00, each double shift (7.5 hours) earns a credit of \$125.00.

Name Bars

Confed Hockey uses names bars for the U9, U11, and U13 program. Not for U7 or Rec League. All Returning Players (2009-2013) have been given name bars to last their time in Confederation Hockey. Players that are in U9 or first year in Confed (U9, U11, U13) will be given a name bar this year. If you have misplaced your name bar you may order replacements at a cost of \$20 each.
